Formed in 1900 as the Women's Health Protective Association, the League took the new name in 1924. Several hundred strong at the peak of membership, the League took as a major goal the planting of trees and flowers throughout Galveston. The League cooperated with Reconstruction Finance Corporation in 1933 to manage work for the unemployed of the city and to provide food for needy persons. The organization also backed the first zoning in Galveston.

Records are correspondence, committee notes, and notes of the corresponding secretary.
