Dr. Fox, 1890-1952, was born in Flushing, New York. He was Director of the United States Public Health Service Quarantine Station in Galveston from 1918-1921. He left Galveston the latter year and served for some years as health officer for various cities and counties in Southern California.

Our holdings include, almost exclusively, a three-hundred page manuscript, with photographs, for an unpublished book, "Our Enemy The Rat". Dr. Fox wrote the manuscript after his departure from the city, but his setting, examples, and experiments focus in Galveston.
