Charlotte Cornell (1895-1963) graduated from Texas State College for Women in Denton and began teaching home economics courses at Galveston school in 1916. She also taught at her alma matter and at the John Sealy Hospital and St. Mary's Infirmary in Galveston. She wrote a column with home and cooking advice for the *Galveston Tribune*, 1947-48.

Sara Ellen Cornell (1897-1947) also graduated from TSCW and began teaching "domestic science" in Galveston schools in 1919. She was also active in First Baptist Church.

Scrapbook #1, contains typed recipes and clippings from Charlotte Cornell's newspaper column. Scrapbooks #2, 1929-35; #3, 1935-43; and #4, 1943-48, contain records and clippings of the Galveston chapter of the Texas State College for Women, College of Industrial Arts Ex-Students' Association. Scrapbook #5, entitled *My Memory Book*, is Sara Ellen Cornell's college scrapbook and includes photographs from her trips to Washington D.C., Virginia, and Gettysburg, Pennsylvania.

A small photo album owned by Charlotte Cornell showing family and friends in Galveston has been transferred to Special Collection #182.
