Her papers include essays, maps, newspaper and magazine clippings, copies of historical marker applications, and copies from the Galveston city directories. Many items were copied from the files of the Galveston & Texas History Center in the Rosenberg Library.

Of special interest are files on historical residences and commercial buildings and files on prominent Galvestonians.
