Miscellaneous collection of correspondence found in the Trueheart-Adriance Building and donated to the Rosenberg Library. Much of the material came damaged.

Heidenheimer Brothers was created by Samson Heidenheimer with his brothers, Abraham and Isaac and were involved in the cotton seed oil business from 1876 until Samson Heidenheimer's death in 1891. The papers in this collection deal mainly with an insurance claim after a fire in 1890.

John Adriance & Sons were realtors for Texas Lands and handled the collection of rents and other needs regarding property leases for George Sealy. The papers here all relate to the leasing of a property along Seawall Boulevard between 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> Street.

James P. Stubbs and his brother, Charles J. Stubbs, were prominent attorneys in Galveston. The papers here relate to a divorce trial between Mary Belle and James P. Stanley.
